SENIOR COLLEGE and POST GRADUATION

The College has been named after the Raja of Sangli - Late Padmabhushan Shrimant Chintamanrao Patwardhan. The college is being run by the Deccan Education Society, Pune and is affiliated to Shivaji University, Kolhapur. The college is situated on Sangli-Miraj Road and a fair frequent of city bus service conveniently connects it with both the cities. Separate divisions have been started for students desiring to receive instructions in English medium. This is the only commerce college in this area offering English medium facility.

Commitment to Quality Education:

The college is committed to provide quality education to the students and make continuous, systematic efforts for achieving improvement in the quality of education.

Admission:

Admissions to all the classes are given strictly on the basis of merit and in accordance with the Govt.rules for the B.C. students.

80% admissions will be reserved for students having passed H.S.C Examination from this college and remaining 20% admissions will be reserved for students from other colleges. ➤ **B.Com Part I -**

Eligibility conditions for the students seeking admissions to B.Com Part I class are as under-

1. The student must have passed the H.S.C Examination conducted by the Maharashtra State Higher Secondary Education Board, with the following subjects.

- 1) English
 - 2) Modern Indian or European Language
 - 3) Accountancy
- Any two subjects in Commerce stream

OR

- 1) English
- 2) Accountancy
- 3) Economics
- 4) Any subject from the optional subjects in the commerce stream
- 5) A 200 Mark vocational course from such courses conducted by Maharashtra State Higher Secondary Education Board.

➤ M.Com Part I -

Students, who have passed the B.Com examination of the Shivaji University or an examination recognized as equivalent by the Shivaji University, are eligible for admission to M.Com Part I.

The rules indicated provide a broad guideline to the students seeking admission to the college. However, the relevant circulars from the Shivaji University should be considered as authoritative and binding.

Note Below:-

- 1) Students from other Universities (either from Maharashtra or from other States) are required to produce Eligibility / Transference / Migration Certificates, etc as per the rules. In case of non-compliance the admission is liable to be cancelled and the college bears no responsibility in such matters.
- 2) Students are advised to retain duly attested Xerox copies of their original documents to avoid inconvenience.
- 3) The name of the student as it appears on the statement of marks of HSC examination and the name as written on the application form should be one and the same. Any difference in the name is likely lead to the cancellation of admission.

Medium of Instruction -

1) English and Marathi (B.Com I, II, III) 2) English only (M.Com I & II)

2) Advanced Accountancy (4 papers) has been introduced as a special subject for M.Com. Degree since 1995-96. Student seeking admission to M.Com. Degree Course and desirous of opting for Advanced Accountancy (4 papers) as special subject should give a separate application while taking admission. Advanced Accountancy being a non-grant subject requires student to pay additional fee as decided by management.

The State Government does not award any educational concession to students, either from backward class or from any other category, whose state domicile is other than the state of Maharashtra.

Furnishing false information with a view to securing any of the concession mentioned above makes the concerned student liable for action according to Government rules. Students are advised to make a specific note of this. For further information contact our office during working hours.

*** Student Aid Fund / Rail Travel Concession, etc**

Needy and deserving students are offered assistance, from Student Aid Fund, for payment of Exam Form Fees or for purchasing necessary textbooks, etc. Depending on the availability of funds, request for assistance toward Hostel Rent, Mess Charges, Medical Charges, City Bus Pass Charges etc may also be considered sympathetically. However, the Fund is not used for awarding scholarships, stipend, loans or prizes.

Students of the college are given necessary recommendation for grant of rail tickets at concessional rates. For detailed information and rules contact our office during working hours.

Library -

The college has a rich Library having more than 45,000 titles, covering a wide range of reference books and special volumes on Commerce, Economics, Law and Management.

It is housed in a separate specially constructed building. The special feature of the library is its Study Room, which is designed and executed under the guidance of the experts. The library furniture, including the furniture in study room, is specially designed and fabricated. The study room is kept open right from the morning till evening throughout the year. Arrangements are also made to keep the study room open in the night time, during the examination period.

Notices regarding the Library are displayed on the college notice board from time to time. Students are advised to read the notices without fail.

Co-Curricular Activities -

The college has various Associations / Mandals to help the students to find expressions to their latent qualities and to develop their personality. These include *Commerce Association *Planning Forum *Post Graduate Students' Association *Commerce Lab, etc. Essay competitions, Elocution competitions, Seminars, Visiting lectures are conducted under the auspices of these associations. All these activities help students to enhance their abilities.

*** Extra Curricular Activities -**

❖ National Cadet Corps (NCC) -

It is an optional activity. Instructions received from the NCC Office are displayed on the Notice Boards. Students interested in joining the NCC should make it a point to read the notices everyday. Students enrolling themselves in the NCC have to complete the prescribed numbers of drills in the academic year. They are also required to return to NCC authorities, the uniforms supplied to them. Such students who have enrolled for NCC have to produce the receipt from NCC authorities. They will not be admitted to the higher class, nor will they be given any Transference Certificate, if such a receipt is not produced.

❖ National Service Scheme (NSS) -

The scheme is being successfully implemented for the students. Notices regarding the scheme are displayed on the college notice board from time to time.

❖ Physical Education -

There is separate physical education section. Mass drills and sports are conducted by the department. Under University rules, Physical Education is compulsory for the First Year Degree Students and 10 marks are given for regular attendance and examinations. Students failing in one or two subjects in the first year examinations are considered for allotment of additional marks from the marks secured in the physical education examination.

❖ Gymkhana -

A well equipped Gymkhana along with a big pavilion is available for the students interested in sports. The college has a large play ground for various outdoor sports. Facility for indoor sports is also available. Students can enjoy a variety of Indian and European sports.

❖ Cultural Association -

Different 'Days' like Teachers' Day, Friendship Day, etc are organized by Cultural Association. The students desiring to participate in the Youth Festival are selected by the Cultural Association.

Instructions regarding Prizes & Endowments -

- 1) Where no specific mention of gender is made, the word student would mean either a male student or a female student.
- 2) The word “passing” unless otherwise specified, would mean passing the March/April examination at the first attempt.
- 3) The conditions regarding prizes are indicated here as broad guidelines. The prizes will be announced only according to the original resolutions passed by the Council of the Deccan Education Society.
- 4) If any Dispute arises regarding the decision about any prize or the interpretation of the original resolutions of the Council, the decision of the Principal will be final.

*** General Instructions-**

1) Cancellation of admission -

If cancellation of admission is desired, it should be convey in writing, with the written consent of the parents. Refund of fees, deposit paid, etc will be governed by rules framed by the University / Government.

2) Regarding return of Original Mark-sheets-

Student should collect back from the college office, the original mark-sheets (submitted with the application for admission) latest by the end of the academic year. If a student fails to do so, the office would return such documents at its convenience.

3) Regarding Information about Examination Programmes / other schedules-

Information & rules related to examination programmes, scholarships, educational concessions, prizes, Gymkhana, Library, NCC, NSS, etc will be displayed on the college notice board from time to time.

The students are advised to make a habit of reading notices without any fail.

4) Hostel-

The college has a Boys' Hostel accommodating 30 seats. For female students, some seats are reserved in the Ladies Hostel of Willingdon College. Some seats are also reserved for backward class students. Information regarding room rent, arrangement for bath, electricity charges, etc is available in the college office on request.

5) Attendance-

It is essential to attend all the classes regularly. To qualify to appear for the University / Board examination, a minimum attendance of 75% is prescribed. Students are advised to note this. Failure to qualify the minimum required attendance may lead to disciplinary actions like fine, or even non-granting of the terms.

6) Discipline-

The college is empowered to regulate, in every manner, the conduct of the students. It is obligatory on the part of the students that they take diligently the tests and all other examinations conducted by the college. They have to complete the home assignments given to them, within the prescribed time.

7) Identity Card -

Every student should always carry with him his duly completed Identity Card. The card must be produced whenever demanded by any employee of the college.

The photograph to be affixed on the Identity Card should be-

- 1) Of 5 cms x 3 cms Size
- 2) Latest photograph
- 3) Taken from front and should show full face
- 4) Without goggles
- 5) Black and white only

All the information on the Identity Card should be filled in correctly and should be got verified from administrative office. It is essential to submit one photograph for college record and get it duly stamped. The card should be taken to the Principal / Vice Principal for his signature which should be obtained personally.

The student should comply with the requirement within one month of his admission, failing which he would be liable for fine of Rs.50/-

If the Identity Card issued at the time of admission is lost or mutilated, the student will be required to take out a new Identity Card paying Rs.15/- plus a fine of Rs.50/-

8) Certificates -

Certificates such as Bonafide Certificate, Conduct Certificate, Transference Certificate required from the college, would be issued 4 days from the date of receipt of application (paying necessary fees and complying with any other requirements) therefor.

Supreme Court Order:-

If any incident of ragging comes to the notice of the authorities, the concerned student shall be given liberty to explain & if his explanation is not found satisfactory the authorities would expel him from the college.

The college has constituted a separate committee to protect the interests of the students against ragging. All such cases of ragging will be referred to the said committee.
